
When I lived in the UK, every city I visited usually had some type of tourist experience based on the history of the area. The one in Canterbury told the story of the pilgrims who would come to see the shrine of Thomas Beckett and it used Geoffrey Chaucer's poem "The Canterbury Tales" to tell the story. A feature of the experience were the smells in each room to really help you feel like you were there in the late fourteen hundreds.

As we approach Christmas and prepare for services and celebrations, we will be making everything as beautiful as we can, ignoring the real down-to-earth history and its smells. Smelly BO, musky animals, and manure. This is the environment God chooses to be born into. The exact opposite of what any human king would choose. When the heir to the throne is born, they are surrounded by the best doctors in the most comfortable palace. The Christ Child is born among the animals and laid in a feed trough. Our nativity scenes make it look rustic, beautiful but lack the authentic sights, sounds and smells.

When the human heir to the throne is born the elite nobles are the first to be told, with the information trickling out and down the social layers of society. Jesus' birth is announced to the shepherds on the hillside. Again, our beautiful scene has rustic shepherds on a hill, watching their sheep, visited by angels with the wonderful message. The reality is, these shepherds are the poorest of the poor, not trusted to give evidence in a trial, unwashed, and scared out of their wits at the sight of these angels.

When you start a new job or new project one of the best pieces of advice is "start how you mean to finish". This is exactly what God does here. God wants the full human experience; not a comfortable cushy life. God puts the socially excluded first. God came into our world, smells and all, to know what being human really feels like. This Christmas as we look at all the beautiful nativity scenes, take a moment to imagine all the sights, sounds, and smells.

As we have not been able to find a new Co-Lay Director, it was discussed and voted on, that we continue for the next 6 months with just the one Diocesan Lay Director and this decision to be reviewed in 6 months time.

# MW51 CURSILLO WEEKEND REPORT (22-25 AUGUST, 2024)

THEME: God's steadfast love

SCRIPTURE: "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, His mercies never

come to an end " Lamentations 3.22

**THEME SONG:** "Freely, freely you have received" *Mission Praise 181* 

MW51 held from 22nd August to 25th August, 2024 was the first combined (men and women) Cursillo weekend held in the Newcastle Anglican Diocese. The weekend was held at the Catalina Retreat Centre, Rathmines and generally followed the format of the Three Day Cursillo Weekend used in the Bathurst Diocese. Table communities were separate for men and women and the accommodation areas for men and women were well spaced for privacy.



Three candidates attended the weekend together with fifteen team members.

The integrity of the Cursillo experience was not lost in the new format. Nine talks were delivered by team members; Spiritual Advisors led us through an experiential experience of a "Journey through the Sacraments"; we worked through a bible study and enjoyed times for rest and quiet reflection.

### **Team**

Team commissioning and training days were held at St Thomas' Anglican Church, Cardiff. All team members contributed significantly to preparation and delivery of the weekend. The team included one LD, two (2) Spiritual Advisors, one Proctor, two (2) Gophers, one muso and one IT person. The Gophers assisted the Proctor when possible. The muso encouraged team members to use songs from Mission Praise which were not necessarily familiar, but beautiful songs. It was a joy to expand our horizons with these songs. Talks given by team members were of a high calibre and flowed well from one talk to the next.



# **Candidates**

Candidates entered into table discussions and poster making vigorously with their table community team members. Table communities were divided into women's table communities and men's table communities. The two men's table communities came together for discussions and poster making. Each candidate expressed that they had had a positive experience by attending the weekend.

### **Format**

The Bathurst Diocese format was used and aspects of former Newcastle Diocese formats were included. The benefit of this new format was to combine some talks to avoid repetition of aspects integral to the weekend, to provide more time for rest/reflection for all attending the weekend and to allow the weekend to finish earlier on the Sunday afternoon. Overall, the weekend was a relaxed time of refreshment in a Christian community.

It was a privilege to lead MW51, to have a supportive and talented team with me. The Cursillo Movement is an important "glue" in our Diocese which we can strengthen through progressively moving forward listening to the ideas expressed by those who have experienced the joy of being a Cursillista.

# **Prayer**

I recently had major surgery, and throughout the whole process I felt calm. Given that I tend towards fear, my only explanation for this calm is the power of prayer; all the prayers that family, friends, and even people that I've never met, prayed for me. 'That peace which passes all understanding.'

People often comment that they're not really 'good' at praying; that they don't feel confident. Prayer is a very personal thing, we don't all need to pray the same way.

I don't feel comfortable in corporate prayer situations. As a young adult we belonged to a charismatic Christian fellowship and there would always be a 'time of prayer' which generally meant that each of us would have a turn to pray (moving around the circle in order). I would generally start to panic "What can I pray?". Then I would think of something to pray about, but, ... someone else would say that! "Oh no! Now what do I pray?" It felt more like a performance than a time with God. Nowadays, if I'm not moved to pray something, I stay silent.

Prayer can be as simple as a conversation with God, touching base with God about our day, our concerns and our joys. We don't need to make it up. There are wonderful Psalms and prayers in the Prayer book. Sometimes people seem reluctant to use the Prayer book, but it is a wonderful resource – familiarise yourself with it.

For some people, the artistic ones amongst us, prayer can be doodling, painting, writing poetry, playing music, creating something, or even doing a jigsaw: finding a vehicle for our thoughts, emotions, etc that carries us beyond ourselves and closer to God. And then, there are hymns and songs of praise. In times of stress, I sing/pray:

O Lord, hear my prayer,

O Lord, hear my prayer:

When I call answer me.

O Lord, hear my prayer,

O Lord, hear my prayer.

Come and listen to me.

Rest assured, God will take what you give and use it. After all, as Paul wrote:

"Likewise, the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God." Romans 8.26-27

# **Greetings from Geoff**

A final message as I stand down from Secretariat. It has been an interesting and bumpy three years.

A year with the most trained Teams in Newcastle Cursillo history. A year with remarkable numbers of candidates, both men and women. Then this year, our first mixed Cursillo, with a mixed team. And next year the plan is for a mixed Cursillo and without Thursday night (start on Friday). A significant number of Cursillistas think Cursillo is just great and leave it alone. But as Bill Nicolle keeps saying, we are part of the Cursillo Movement, not Institution. We will keep evolving, as what we offer is something valuable and special.

At National Secretariat we had one priest as delegate from a Diocese that has let Cursillo close. For most of the same issues we face: ageing, less volunteers, costs, lower attendance (and dare I say, some priestly opposition). They are re-starting and it is a result of a motion passed at their Synod that the Bishop should take steps to support Cursillo's return. The Synod (lay and clergy) had discovered Cursillo was having a greater impact (positive) than anyone had realised. Independent of that, our Bishop Peter described Cursillo as *Palanca to the Diocese*.

Our focus is on authenticity. A lot comes through the Talks and many of the most impactful talks are from people speaking from brokenness or recovery in some form. The actions of the Holy Spirit and the fact of God's love tend to shine through. Part of where I get my observation that a Cursillo Weekend is, for many, a group hug from God.

I just overheard a conversation about parents disowning a girl for getting pregnant outside marriage. I can't help but think of Paul: "For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39). An aspect of our Cursillo message is that God loves the unloved!

Has Cursillo run its course? Look at the world and divisions and lack of God's plan visible. **No** 


Can we keep going as we are and appeal to a new generation (or three)? No










# **New Secretariat Members 2025**
